BEST EVENT: NATIONAL HOLIDAY AND THE HISTORIC FLAG THROWING CONTEST, May 1

It's the Labor Day holiday in Italy and across Europe, in honour of the workers of the world. Italians will be enjoying the day off, and there will be less buses and trains than usual. There is the incredibly exciting flag throwing competition, where expert flag throwers compete for the Marzocco Trophy! The Marzocco is the heraldic lion that represents the free Republic of Florence, with the most famous Marzocco located in Piazza della Signoria where the contest is being held. The original statue was created by Donatello in the 15th Century, and is now housed in the Bargello, while a copy rests in its place in the piazza. The lion is carved with his paw placed protectively over the symbol of Florence, the red lily. The flag throwing demonstrates extremely talented choreography, creating a stunning visual effect as the flags twirls and fly through the air. BEST ANNIVERSARY: LA FIORITA PARADE IN PIAZZA DELLA SIGNORIA: REMEMBERING THE DEATH OF SAVONAROLA, May 23

The Dominican friar Girolamo Savonarola, prior of San Marco and a stern moralizer, was burnt at the stake in Piazza della Signoria on 23 May 1498. Every year, on the anniversary of that date, a Mass is celebrated in Palazzo Vecchio in his memory, and flowers – the Fiorita – are laid on the spot where he was burnt. The ceremony is accompanied by music and a performance by flag-wavers. Don't miss the traditional "Fiorita": the homage starts al 9:30 am from piazza della Signoria with the "Infiorata" and the historical procession arriving at Ponte Vecchio at 10:00am where petals of roses are symbolically thrown on the Arno river.

BEST TRADITION FOR MAY: GIORNO DELLA MAMMA, 2nd Sunday in May

It is Mother's Day in Italy, the day to celebrate mothers everywhere or any special woman who

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raised you. For those travelling with their mother in Florence on May 13th, remember to give her an extra hug and wish her the happiest of days, Italian style of course... with an Aperol Spritz toast, springtime flowers, or an extra-large, double scoop of gelato!

BEST SPORT: 100KM INTERNATIONAL WALKING RACE FROM FLORENCE TO FAENZA, May 25-26

The 100 km of the Passatore is an ultramarathon running competition that takes place annually on the last Saturday of May, starting from Florence and finishing in Faenza. The race, which was held for the first time in 1973, is named after the Passatore, a popular figure from the history and folklore of Romagna. The 100 km international walking race from Florence to Faenza starts from Via Calzaiuoli in Florence and continues along the via Faentina, passing through Fiesole, Borgo San Lorenzo, Marradi, Brisighella. The arrival of the winner at Faenza (Piazza del Popolo) is due at 9.45pm. For more information, see the website.

BEST EXHIBITION: MIDA, THE MOSTRA INTERNAZIONALE DELL'ARTIGIANATO AT FORTEZZA DI BASSO, Until May 1

SPRING GARDENS: INTERNATIONAL IRIS GARDEN AND THE ROSE GARDEN

The Iris is the symbol of Florence, the deep red of the Giglio di Firenze! Expect beautiful flowers, meticulously refined over generations by the careful hands of their keepers. While you are so close, it is the perfect time to visit **the stunning Florence Rose Garden**. Open all year around, the roses are in full bloom throughout May, and with over 350 different types of roses to enjoy, this is a heavenly treat for your senses. Take a book to enjoy on the grass. Also in the rose garden are sculptures by Belgian artist, Jean Michael Folon, which sit against the Florence city backdrop beautifully. There is also a Japanese Garden with a waterfall and tea pagoda that was a gift to Florence from the city of Kyoto.

Until May, enjoy the international Festival La Democrazia del Corpo ("Democracy of the Body") by Virgilio Sieni. The "Democracy of the Body" proposes a cycle of performance works intended as excursions exploring the body. This year the festival returns to the central theme of the artists themselves, those who research and build bridges with history: passages that are understood as meeting places that are always open and poetically in mutation, where the reference to the body, to musical form, to gravity, to the philosophy of space, to its care and way of hosting the other, creates the initiatory gesture of encounter and relationship. DOMENICOALMUSEO: STATE MUSEUMS FREE FOR EVERYONE, AND CIVIC MUSEUMS FREE FOR RESIDENTS ON THE FIRST SUNDAY OF EVERY MONTH

EXHIBITIONS

ANSELM KIEFER ON SHOW AT PALAZZO STROZZI, Until July

Palazzo Strozzi presents a major exhibition dedicated to one of the greatest masters of the 20th and 21st century art, Anselm Kiefer. The exhibition allows direct contact with the art of the German artist thorough new and historical works that engage in a profound dialogue with the Renaissance architecture of Palazzo Strozzi, including a new work especially created for the palace's internal courtyard. Fallen Angel is a journey that reflects on topics such as identity, history, and philosophy. Through painting, sculpture, installation and photography, Kiefer's art offers deep introspection into the human condition, in a complex weaving of connections between the past, present and future. ART OF UZBEKISTAN ON SHOW AT PALAZZO PITTI, Until July 27

LEDIESIS - CORPUS DOMINAE, ART SHOW AND CONFERENCE AT LE MURATE ART DISTRICT (M.A.D.), Until May 31

DIVINA SIMULACRA AT THE GALLERIE DEGLI UFFIZI, Until June

The main statues of the ancient Medici collection are now on display on the ground floor of the Uffizi. The Uffizi's most beautiful ancient statues on display in the rooms of the Vasari Museum: in these spacious rooms, visitors will be able to see and admire them up close, in all their beauty. This is the great exhibition 'Divina Simulacra. Masterpieces of Classical Sculpture from the Gallery'. On display for the first time are individual replicas of classical marble groups that, in the historical setting, are located in different places in the Gallery. Website.

RETURNS: FROM MODIGLIANI TO MORANDI AT MUSEO NOVECENTO, Until September

(From The Florentine Magazine) Museo Novecento celebrates ten years since its inauguration in 2014 with a major exhibition titled Returns: From Modigliani to Morandi dedicated to the history of one of its most prized ensembles, the Alberto Della Ragione Collection. Donated to the City of Florence following the devastating flood in 1966, the works are now reunited with the invaluable masterpiece by the Livornese artist, Amedeo Modigliani. The idea conceived by the director of the museum, Sergio Risaliti, sees the rooms of the former Leopoldine on the second floor of the museum transformed for the occasion, with the exhibition curated by Eva Francioli, Chiara Toti and Sergio Risaliti on show until September 15. DANCE, THEATRE, CINEMA AND MUSIC

THE 86TH EDITION OF THE MAGGIO MUSICALE FIORENTINO, Until June 13

The Theatre of the Maggio Musicale Fiorentino owes its name to the prestigious Maggio Musicale Festival, the oldest in Italy. Founded in Florence in 1933, the festival quickly became a centre of dissemination of European musical culture, proposing new and unconventional ideas in regards to classical repertoire and contemporary compositions. The festival showcases two months of programming until June 13th with three operas, Turandot, Jeanne Dark, Tosca, five choral symphonic concerts with the Orchestra and Coro del Maggio conducted by Daniele Gatti and Zubin Mehta, the symphonic concerts of Myung-Whun Chung leading the Maggio team and Riccardo Muti with the Wiener Philharmoniker, a ballet and collaborations with the Fiesole School of Music, the Cherubini Conservatory, the Orchestra of Tuscany, the Italian Youth Orchestra. THE CATTEDRALE DELL'IMMAGINE PRESENTS INSIDE VAN GOGH

In the heart of Florence, the deconsecrated church of Santo Stefano al Ponte was reborn with the name "the Cathedral of the Image", transforming itself into the first permanent Italian center for Immersive Art Experiences. Now showing is *Inside Van Gogh*, the new immersive multimedia show,

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created by Crossmedia and directed by Stefano Fake. A 35-minute digital narrative developed through 360° multiprojection of high-definition images and the Dolby HD audio diffusion of a captivating soundtrack. Enjoy the complex human and artistic story of Vincent van Gogh, one of the most famous and beloved artists of all time. The multimedia experience is enriched by an educational introductory section with infographics and monitors, Oculus stations for experiencing the 3D virtual reality journey inside some famous paintings, and the immersive 'hall of mirrors,' an enveloping kaleidoscope of images located within the immersive hall. ERINA YASHANO AND ETTORE PAGANO WITH THE ORCHESTRA OF TOSCANA AT TEATRO VERDI, May 16

In her second program with ORT, Erina Yashima measures herself with Tchaikovsky's Fifth Symphony. Composed in 1888, during a time of personal turbulence for the composer, this symphony explores themes of destiny, struggle and, ultimately, triumph. A good performance for Erina, born in Germany to Japanese parents, currently at the helm of the Komische Oper in Berlin, but contested by the largest orchestras in the world. With her a budding cello talent: Ettore Pagano, born in 2003 and already a star of the international cello. He graduated in 2021 from the Santa Cecilia Conservatory, in Rome, also a student of Enrico Dindo, David Geringas and Antonio Meneses. He has to face one of the most fearsome concertos written for cello, that of Dvořák. More information and bookings here.


AMICI DELLA MUSICA

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
